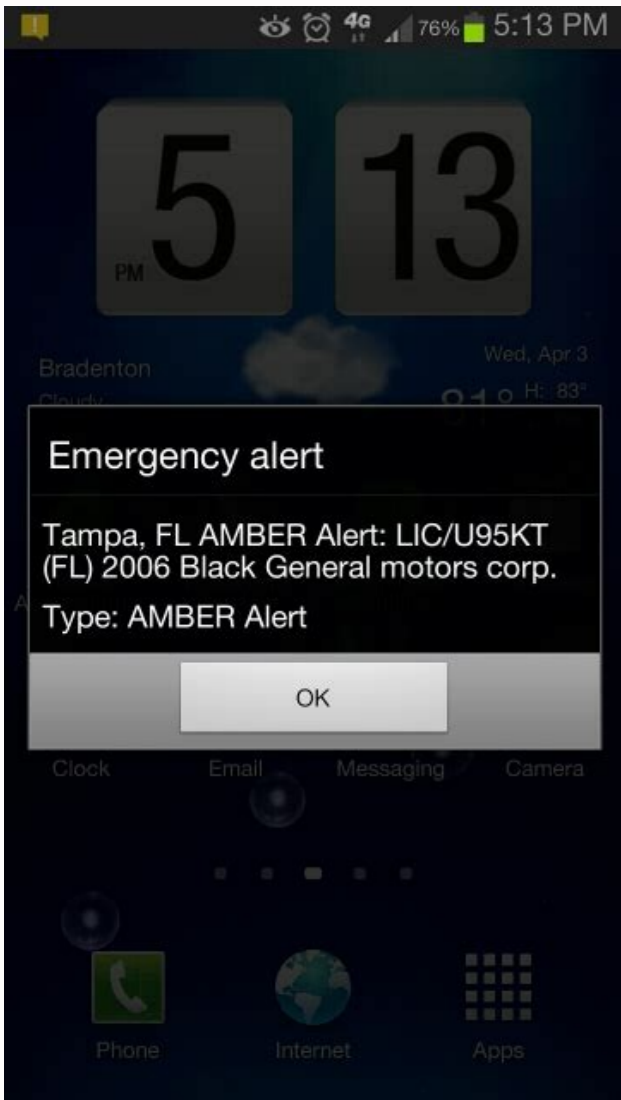


Stop amber alerts on android phone

The AMBER Alert system is a voluntary partnership between law enforcement, broadcasters, transportation agencies, and the wireless industry to inform citizens of serious child-abduction cases in their area. While awareness is important, you might want to know how to turn off AMBER Alerts so they do not go off at inappropriate times. Android phones provide the option to disable AMBER Alerts as well as other emergency alerts, such as severe weather warnings. The process will vary depending on the type of phone you are using. These instructions apply to stock Android phones and Samsung Galaxy versions 10 and 9. On most Android devices, you can disable alerts in the phone's settings.

Some older devices might not be capable of receiving wireless emergency alerts. Check your device's owner's manual or contact your wireless carrier if you are not receiving AMBER alerts and other alerts you should be. Choose Settings from your Home screen. Make sure your Settings menu is List view. If not, select the menu button in the upper-right corner and choose List View. Scroll down and select Apps and Notifications. Scroll to the bottom, and select Advanced. Select Emergency Alerts. Clear the checkbox next to AMBER alerts. You can also disable alerts for Extreme threats and Severe threats. The Settings menu lets you disable alerts. Go to Settings > Connections > More connection settings and tap Wireless Emergency Alerts. Tap the Settings menu (three dots) for Wireless Emergency Alerts. From the options that appear, select Settings. Select Alert types. Select the alerts you want to disable. The alert settings are in the Messaging window. Open Messaging from any Home screen. Select the Menu button in the upper-right corner, and choose Settings. Select More under Advanced. Choose Emergency Alerts at the bottom of the list of options. Clear the checkbox next to AMBER alerts. You can also disable or enable alerts for the following: Imminent extreme alertsImminent severe alertsPublic Safety AlertsState/Local test alerts If you want to receive AMBER alerts without the loud noise that accompanies them, scroll down on the alerts menu and disable the Alert sound slider. You can leave Alert vibration on if you want the phone to vibrate when there is an alert or disable this setting for a text notification only. Along with AMBER alerts, most phones feature settings for other types of alert notifications. Wireless Emergency Alerts are sent by authorized government alerting authorities through your mobile carrier. Wireless customers do not pay any connection or data fees when receiving WEA messages. Weather alerts include warnings sent for: TsunamisTornado and Flash Flood WarningsHurricane, Typhoon, Dust Storm and Extreme Wind Warnings State/Local alerts include notifications for: Emergency requiring evacuationEmergency requiring immediate action State and local testing alerts are disabled by default. You can enable them in your emergency notifications settings if desired. Presidential alerts will only occur during a national emergency. According to FEMA, Presidential alerts cannot be disabled. Depending what notifications you want, you can change settings for certain apps or for your whole phone. Notifications show when you swipe down from the top of your screen. Some notifications can also show on your lock screen and home screen. Important: Use notifications Clear notifications To clear one notification, swipe it left or right. To clear all notifications, scroll to the bottom of your notifications and tap Clear all. To clear all silent notifications, next to "silent notifications," tap Close Tip: You can clear some notifications only when they're done. For example, you can clear a music player notification after you stop the music. Snooze notifications Open you phone's Settings app. Tap Notifications. Turn on Allow notification snoozing. To snooze a notification, drag it slightly left or right, and then tap Snooze. To pick a time, tap the Down arrow. Reply, archive, expand & more To expand a notification, tap the Down arrow. Then, to act directly from a notification, tap an action, like Reply or Archive. Some apps show a dot when you get a notification. Touch and hold the app with the dot to see the oldest notification. Then, clear each to show the next. Learn about notification dots. Control emergency broadcast notifications Important: Settings can vary by phone. For more info, contact your device manufacturer. You can turn alert types on or off, find past alerts, and control sound and vibration. On your phone, open the Settings app. Tap Notifications Wireless emergency alerts. Choose how often you want to receive alerts and which settings you want to turn on. You can use this setting to manage certain emergency messages, like disaster warnings, threat notifications, and AMBER alerts. For more info, contact your device manufacturer. Option 1: In your Settings app Open your phone's Settings app. Tap Notifications App settings. Under "Most recent," find apps that recently sent you notifications. To find more apps, in the dropdown menu, tap All apps. Tap the app. Turn the app's notifications on or off. You can turn off all notifications for a listed app. To pick specific categories of notifications, tap the app's name. Tip: If you don't see "Recently sent," you're using an older Android version. Instead, tap App notifications and tap an app. You can turn notifications, notification dots, and notification categories on or off. If an app has categories, you can tap a category for more options. Option 2: On a notification To find your notifications, from the top of your phone screen, swipe down. Touch and hold the notification, and then tap Settings. Choose your settings: To turn off all notifications, turn off All notifications. Turn on or off notifications you want to receive. To allow notification dots, turn on Allow notification dot. Option 3: In the certain app You can control many app notifications from a settings menu in the app. For example, an app could have a setting to choose the sound that app's notifications make. To make these changes, open the app and search for the settings menu. Choose if notifications interrupt you or stay silent Important: Settings can vary by phone. For more info, contact your device manufacturer. On some Android devices, you can choose what kind of notifications an app sends you: Alerting: You'll hear a sound, get a message on your lock screen, and find the app's icon in the status bar. Silent: Your phone won't make a sound or vibrate. But the notification will show up when you swipe down from the top of your screen. Option 1: In your Settings app Open your phone's Settings app. Tap Apps & notifications Notifications. Under "Recently Sent," tap an app. Tap a type of notification. Choose your options: Choose Alerting or Silent. To see a banner for alerting notifications when your phone is unlocked, turn on Pop on screen. If you chose "Silent," you can turn Minimize on or off. Option 2: On a notification After you swipe down from the top of your screen, drag the notification slightly right or left. Then tap Settings. Tap Alerting or Silent Apply. Control how notifications show on your lock screen Option 2: Show all notifications Important: Settings can vary by phone. For more info, contact your device manufacturer. Open your phone's Settings app. Tap Apps & notifications Notifications. Under "Lock screen," tap Notifications on lock screen or On lock screen. Choose Show alerting and silent notifications. On some phones, choose Show all notification content. Tip: If you pick this option as your default, you can still restrict certain apps on your lock screen. You can have certain apps "Hide sensitive notification content" or "Don't show notifications at all" on your lock screen.
